Beginning the Great Lent and Journey to Pascha

SUNDAY OF ORTHODOXY: The Sunday of Orthodoxy, the commemoration of the restoration of the Holy Icons, is celebrated the first Sunday of the Great Lent. At the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy service, Orthodox faithful carry icons in a procession around the church. Parishioners brought in icons to be blessed, and our Parish Council members and Sunday School students joined in this annual tradition. On that day Markus Monolidis also shared his Junior Division winning Oratorical presentation on the importance of icons in our daily lives.

KOULOUMA: On the first day of the Lenten Season, (Kathara Deftera) Monday March 14th, the St. Helen Philoptochos put together a delicious Koulouma luncheon following the Great Compline service. 






THE PASCHAL SERMON OF SAINT JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

(Read during the Resurrection Service)



If any man be devout and loves God, let him enjoy this fair and radiant triumphal feast! If any man be a wise servant, let him rejoicing enter into the joy of his Lord. If any have labored long in fasting, let him how receive his recompense. If any have wrought from the first hour, let him today receive his just reward. If any have come at the third hour, let him with thankfulness keep the feast. If any have arrived at the sixth hour, let him have no misgivings; because he shall in no wise be deprived therefore. If any have delayed until the ninth hour, let him draw near, fearing nothing. And if any have tarried even until the eleventh hour, let him, also, be not alarmed at his tardiness.

For the Lord, who is jealous of his honor, will accept the last even as the first. He giveth rest unto him who cometh at the eleventh hour, even as unto him who hath wrought from the first hour. And He shows mercy upon the last, and cares for the first; and to the one He giveth, and upon the other He bestows gifts. And He both accepts the deeds, and welcomes the

intention, and honors the acts and praises the offering.

Wherefore, enter ye all into the joy of your Lord; receive your reward, both the first, and likewise the second. You rich and poor together, hold high festival! You sober and you heedless, honor the day! Rejoice today, both you who have fasted and you who have disregarded the fast. The table is full-laden; feast ye all sumptuously. The calf is fatted; let no one go hungry away. Enjoy ye all the feast of faith: Receive ye all the riches of loving-kindness.

Let no one bewail his poverty, for the universal Kingdom has been revealed. Let no one weep for his iniquities, for pardon has shown forth from the grave. Let no one fear death, for the Savior's death has set us free. He that was held prisoner of it has annihilated it. By descending into Hell, He made Hell captive. He embittered it when it tasted of His flesh. And Isaiah, foretelling this, did cry: Hell, said he, was embittered when it encountered You in the lower regions.

It was embittered, for it was abolished.

It was embittered, for it was mocked.

It was embittered, for it was slain.

It was embittered, for it was overthrown.

It was embittered, for it was fettered in chains.

It took a body, and met God face to face.

It took earth, and encountered Heaven.

It took that which was seen, and fell upon the Unseen.

O Death, where is thy sting? O Hell, where is thy victory?

Christ is risen, and thou art overthrown!

Christ is risen, and the demons are fallen!

Christ is risen, and the angels rejoice!

Christ is risen, and life reigns!

Christ is risen, and not one

dead remains in the grave.

For Christ, being risen from the dead, is become the first-fruits of those who have fallen asleep.

To Him be glory and dominion unto ages of ages.

Amen.

A Message from Father Teodor



The Journey of Holy Week

The Services of Holy Week and Pascha in the Orthodox Church are at the core of our liturgical life. Most Greek Orthodox, even those who only come to church a few times a year, are familiar with the unique and moving services of the Good Friday and the Anastasi. But the Holy Week is so much more than that; the Church invites us to journey with our Lord from the triumph of the raising of Lazarus and the Palm Sunday, through Jesus' confrontations with the religious authorities, to the cross and, finally, to the victory of the Resurrection. The services of Holy Week tell one complete story; only by following each one can we truly understand what God has done for us.

In order to defeat death, which was not created by God, but was brought through disobedience and sin, God Himself not only entered our world, but confronted death face-to-face. The power of death which held us captive from the beginning was broken. We feel the power of this truth at midnight of Pascha as we wait in the dark, waiting for the one flame to come forth with the exclamation: "Come receive the Light", and for this Light of Life to come to each of us, until the whole Church is aglow with the Light of the Resurrection. Then, seeing this light, we can say with Saint Paul, "O death, where is your sting? O grave, where is your victory?" (1 Corinthians 15:55)

But this light will be an empty experience if we have not walked the long and difficult path of the Cross. If the Resurrection is the victory of life, the Cross is the victory of love. The two form one eternal whole, which brings us back again to the services of Holy Week.

The special period that we call Holy Week is rapidly approaching as it does every year. Where will you be during this blessed time? We invite you to experience Holy Week, not just through Holy Friday and Anastasi, but through the entire journey with our Lord. This is the complete story and journey: from Saturday of Lazarus, through the Entrance in Jerusalem, through the Bridegroom Services, then experiencing the healing of soul and body that comes from the Holy Unction service, through the intense and Spirit-filled services of the 12 Gospels, Apokathelosis, Epitaphios and then the Resurrection service and the Agape.

By living each service, by contemplating the meaning of each day, we are drawn ever closer to the love of God who chose to empty Himself in every way in order to love us. What better way can there be of spending our time, making the smallest effort of love on our part in response to God's infinite love for us.

Kalo Pascha!






TLC "LOVE IS IN THE AIR" LUNCHEON

HONORING MOM ON HER DAY




