
<u>FALL FESTIVAL</u>



Feast of the Entrance into The Temple of The Theotokos November 21

The Feast of the Entrance into the Temple of Our Most Holy Lady the Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary is celebrated on November 21 each year. The Feast commemorates when as a young child, the Virgin Mary entered the Temple in Jerusalem.

The birth and early life of the Virgin Mary is not recorded in the Gospels or other books of the New Testament; however, this information can be found in a work dating from the second century known as the Book of James or Protevangelion.

When Mary was three years old, Joachim and Anna decided that the time had come to fulfill their promise and to offer her to the Lord. Joachim gathered the young girls of the neighborhood to form an escort, and he made them go in front of Mary, carrying torches. Captivated by the torches, the young child followed joyfully to the Temple, not once looking back at her parents nor weeping as she was parted from them.



The holy Virgin ran toward the Temple, overtaking her attendant maidens and threw herself into the arms of the High Priest Zacharias, who was waiting for her at the gate of the Temple with the elders. Zacharias blessed her saying, "It is in you that He has glorified your name in every generation. It is in you that He will reveal the Redemption that He has prepared for His people in the last days."

Then, Zacharias brought the child into the Holy of Holies—a place where only the High Priest was permitted to enter once a year on the Day of Atonement. He placed her on the steps of the altar, and the grace of the Lord descended upon her. She arose and expressed her joy in a dance as wonder seized all who saw this happen.

The Virgin Mary dwelt in the Temple for nine years until, reaching an age for marriage, she was taken from the Temple by the priests and elders and entrusted to Joseph as the guardian of her virginity. The Entrance of the Theotokos into the Temple signifies her total dedication to God and her readiness for her future vocation as the Mother of the Incarnate Lord. This is a feast of anticipation. As honor is shown to Mary, the faithful are called to look forward to the Incarnation of Christ, celebrated in a little more than a month by the Feast of the Nativity on December 25.

The Feast of the Entrance of the Theotokos is celebrated with the Divine Liturgy of Saint John Chrysostom which will be conducted on the morning of November 21st at Sts. Constantine and Helen Church at 10:00 am preceded by a Matins (Orthros) service at 9:00 am.

NATIONAL PHILOPTOCHOS SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 2nd

On Sunday, November 2nd, our church honored the members of the St. Helen's Philoptochos Society, who do so much in support of our church, our community, and our faith. A special tray was passed by the ladies of our Philoptochos to benefit the Ecumenical Patriarchate, and an Artoklasia was offered. A special memorial was offered for the departed members of the Philoptochos. The Philoptochos is the separately incorporated Philanthropic arm of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America. The Society was founded in 1931 by Archbishop Athenagoras, who had a vision of the role women could play in the life of the Orthodox Church. Today, Philoptochos chapters are located in every Greek Orthodox parish in the United States.

In the 2013 - 2014 fiscal year, the Philoptochos contributed nearly \$13,000 to a variety of charitable causes. Some of the philanthropic efforts supported include: Autism Assistance Fund, Saint Photios Shrine, Orthodox Christian Mission Center, Sisterhood of Saint Basil Academy, International Orthodox Christian Charities, Hellenic College Holy Cross Scholarship Fund, United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund, World Medical Relief Fund, St. Michael's Senior Home, and Children's Hospital of Michigan.




