

SUNDAY OF ORTHODOXY A SPECIAL DAY TO REMEMBER!

March 5, 2017, the Sunday of Orthodoxy, was a very special day at Sts. Constantine and Helen Church! His Eminence Metropolitan Nicholas celebrated the Divine Liturgy along with Fr. Teodor, and assisted by Deacon Alex Radulescu. The Sunday of Orthodoxy is the first Sunday of Great Lent. The theme of this Sunday is the victory of the icons and the "Triumph of Orthodoxy." Each Sunday of Orthodoxy, Parish Council members and Sunday School students and teachers join the Clergy and Altar Boys in a procession around the church, carrying icons. Parishioners also bring their icons to church to be blessed.

After the procession of icons around the church, our congregation was filled with emotion and pride as 27 of our Altar Boys (including two sets of twins!) were tonsured by His Eminence as "Acolyte and Reader." Tonsure a special blessing and honor. Metropolitan read the prayer invoking upon them the Holy Spirit. After the prayer, he cut a little of each Altar Boys' hair as a symbol of their gift of sacrifice to God, and placed the Orarion (sash) over their neck as a symbol of their dedication to serving God. While doing this, the Metropolitan proclaims "Axios" which means "Worthy" and all the people in church respond by saying "Axios" as an expression of their agreement and joy.

Each young man received a certificate from the Metropolis of Detroit recognizing their outstanding accomplishment. It may not be a world record, but we think 27 Altar Boys in one day is pretty impressive! Congratulations to all of the young men who were tonsured-their names, and more photos appear within the Visions.

A Message from Father Teodor

Resurrection Power

On "the first day of the week, early in the morning," the Scripture says, some women made their way along the path that led to His tomb, wondering who would roll away the stone for them.



But when they arrived, they found that the stone had already been rolled away. And an angel there told them, "You're looking in the wrong place. You're looking for Jesus among the dead. He is not dead. He is alive. He is risen, like He foretold."

"He is Risen!" That is what we celebrate Easter morning, this is for what we are preparing for seven weeks, fasting, praying and repenting. He is Risen, and what a difference His Resurrection has made! Saint Paul wrote, "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory?" "Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through Jesus Christ, our Lord." 1 Corinthians 15:55;57

What a difference the Resurrection makes! Because Christ is Risen we, you and I can know Him and identify with Him, and be like Him! He is Risen and we can know Him, can touch Him and can unite with Him in Holy Communion.

But there's a very important question that we should ask ourselves. Do we really know Jesus Christ? I don't mean; "do we know about him?" Do we truly know Jesus Christ?

We come, some of us a few times a year to hear ABOUT Jesus, and we think that is enough to call ourselves Christians. But do we really know Him, not OF Him?

It has been nearly 2000 years since Jesus was crucified, buried and resurrected. We who call ourselves Christians have a choice to make: Believe in Jesus, try and really know Him, or dismiss Him! Accept His claims, or reject Him!

There is no middle ground! Either we open the door to Christ, and meet Him... really know Him, or deny Him, and live only for ourselves, come to church once or twice a year to hear OF Him, but never get to actually know Christ.

If you have made the choice to follow Christ, then I want you to consider living your life in light of Jesus' Resurrection! What does that mean? What can you do?

Get to know Him and communicate with Him in Prayer, get involved in worship and fellowship regularly and share God's love and what difference He makes in your life with those around you. Bring your children and grandchildren to meet Jesus, like He himself said: "Let the children come to me and do not stop them!"

As all nature is awakening, in the beautiful days of spring, so should we individually, as a family and as a congregation arise from our lethargy to live our lives as true Orthodox Christians.




































QUICK TAKES: NEWS AND NOTES




