

# **OBSERVING THE GREAT LENT**

During the Great Lent, as we are placing extra emphasis on prayer, fasting, and the reading of scripture, the Orthodox Church is alive with many meaningful services and special activities. As we do each year at Saints Constantine and Helen, on March 11<sup>th</sup>, the season of Lent began with the Great Compline service. The service, presided over by His Eminence Metropolitan Nicholas, featured many readings by participating Clergy from our sister parishes, including: Fr. John Artemas, Fr. Anthony Cook, Fr. Philemon Karamanos, Fr. Nicolaos Kotsis, Fr. Nicholas Marcus, Fr. Alex Radulescu, and Deacon Bryce Buffenbarger. Following the service, our St. Helen Philoptochos hosted the 82nd annual "Koulouma" Luncheon, featuring delicious Lenten dishes. This event brings parishioners from many area churches together in fellowship to begin this Lenten period. Many thanks to His Eminence, visiting Clergy, and to all our Philoptochos volunteers!


Each Wednesday during Lent, our church offers a Presanctified Liturgy, followed by a Lenten Pot Luck supper hosted by one of our parish organizations. On these evenings, there is also a presentation in the Hellenic Cultural Center where we

faith. Guest presenters included area Clergy, Presbytera Julie Honeycutt and David Conrad, Coordinator of Ecumenical and Interfaith Dialogue for the Catholic Archdiocese of Detroit.

GOYA members participated in the regional GOYA Lenten Retreat, held at Holy Trinity Church in Toledo; and our H.O.P.E. and J.O.Y. groups are learning about "Sharing Our Blessings" by collecting money (wearing bunny ears!) and putting together Easter baskets to be given to 45 Westland area children in need.

## A Message from Father Teodor

We are once again approaching the moving and spiritually filled services of the Holy Week. Most Greek Orthodox Christians, even those who don't attend the church regularly, are familiar with these unique services that take us from the Resurrection of Lazarus and Palm Sunday to the glorious Resurrection of our Lord.



Even as we are recalling these historical events, we have to remember that the Orthodox Holy Week services are not theatrical plays. That is not something that happens in the Orthodox Church. We might say that we "commemorate the events" but even that word is inadequate to fully describe the services of this Great and Holy Week. We don't simply commemorate the events of Holy Week, we live them. We are not a passive audience, we are active participants.

We must remind ourselves of this truth each and every year in order to appreciate the greatness of Holy Week. The Great Lent and the Great and Holy Week are not set by the church simply as an opportunity to deprive ourselves of meat and dairy and to reward ourselves with an extravagant family meal on Easter day. Holy Week is our opportunity to remind ourselves that we have a choice: either to stand with Christ or scatter like many of Jesus' followers did after he was arrested.

We must ask ourselves, "Who will I be this Holy Week?" Will I be Peter, rejecting Him and then repent? Will I be Pontius Pilate, washing my hands after condemning Him? Will I be Judas, choosing money over Him? These are important questions for us to ask in the most personal and thoughtful way. Jesus helped and healed so many in His ministry and yet the vast majority abandoned Him in His time of need. He comes this year again to offer us an opportunity: to be with Him, who also has so blessed our families, and offered His healing and comfort to all who ask.

Where will we be this Holy Week?

Will it be our face that Christ sees as He looks down from the Cross this year in the darkness of our church on Holy Thursday evening? And if we are not with Christ throughout this Great and Holy Week, where will we be? Shopping and getting ready for meals and celebrations, or making a priority to be with the Lord through His passion?

All of us can remember the inspiring Holy Weeks when we were children—the Bridegroom icon processing out of the altar, the Holy Oil upon our face and hands, the Cross illuminated by candle light in the darkness of the church, the Body being lowered into a shroud, the outdoor procession around the Church, the bay leaves and roses floating in the air, and a sea of candles raised into the air in joy as we proclaimed: "Christos Anesti!". How many memories do we have from the years when we missed these sacred services? On the Holy Weeks that we were not in church, who among us can name one thing they did on that week?

This year, as in every year, the questions are always the same. Who will we be this Holy Week and Easter? Where will we be?

## FEEDING THE NEEDY INITIATIVES CONTINUE

Most of our parishioners are well aware of the Men's Club efforts to feed those in need at Thanksgiving, providing holiday dinners to families in the cities of Westland and Livonia through the *John Koinis Feed the Needy Program*. What you may not be aware of is their continuing efforts to provide food for low-income families throughout the year.

The need is great. In Wayne, Oakland, and Macomb Counties, one in four children (24.8%) lives in poverty. In the City of Detroit, over 57% of children under age 18 live in poverty. Using poverty rates as a proxy for hunger, over 1 in 2 children in the City of Detroit are at risk of hunger. Nearly four million (3.9) households in Michigan live at risk of hunger.



Working with Orthodox Detroit Outreach at the Saints Peter and Paul Community Center in Detroit, our Men's Club sponsors periodic Sunday suppers for the needy throughout the year. Meals are prepared by our Hellenic Cultural Center staff, and are served by St. Con's parishioners – Men's Club members and GOYA members have acted as volunteer servers. We are proud of the efforts of our parishioners to serve our neighbors in need!















## H.O.P.E. & J.O.Y. 'ALL THINGS ARE POSSIBLE IF YOU BELIEVE!'




